Developments in Customs and Foreign Trade Law

In the forty years since founding of the European Customs union, customs law has developed at a remarkable pace. A customs union does not only require a single customs territory, abolition of internal customs duties and a common external customs tariff but also a modern, harmonized and uniformly applied customs law. The European Customs Law Conference in Luxembourg (that also celebrates the 20th anniversary of the founding of the EFA) investigates the development of European customs law under the aspects "What was good?", "What was bad?" and "The Way Forward." The political future of the Customs Union will also be profoundly affected by the imminent introduction of the Modernized Customs Code (MCC).

Jurisprudence of the ECJ

The European Court of Justice functions as "the guardian of the Community." This aspect forms the subject of several presentations and will be examined in detail using customs debt as an example. Related aspects include the Commission's imposition of financial charges on Member States that can lead to Customs administrations making controversial decisions in relation to industry as well as the MCC's response to the development of jurisprudence.

AEO Status

The concept of the Authorized Economic Operator (AEO) has already been dealt with at a number of Customs Law Conferences. However, there is still a need for information on the way that companies and administrations have implemented the AEO as well as their experiences in working with it. Presentations will assess the status of the AEO in Europe, using benchmarking and practical reports from industry, administration and consultants. Another interesting topic is the mutual recognition of the AEO at international level.

Proposal for a Directive on the general system of excise duties

In order to introduce an IT system that supervises movements of goods subject to excise tax under suspensive arrangements between the Member States, the Directive concerning the General Arrangements for Excise Duty must be amended. In this respect, changes are to be made to the suspensive procedure (including irregular departures) and free movement that take account of legal developments.
